MEDICAL TREATMENT SUPPORT



"Helping a child is the best investment you can make in the future"

Core work area of TBCF is medical treatment support for infants and small children. Through the year TBCF has been able to support 31 babies & Children.

This year TBCF saw surge of Pre-term born babies cases from various hospitals. Even a baby born with weight of 450gms, was successfully treated and discharged. One of the rare success cases of Maharashtra, treated at Neo Hospital, Nashik, this was also widely covered by media.

Cancer is a disease in which some of the body's cells grow uncontrollably and spread to other parts of the body. Cancerous tumors spread into, or invade, nearby tissues and can travel to distant places in the body to form new tumors (a process called metastasis). Cancerous tumors may also be called malignant tumors. Many cancers form solid tumors, but cancers of the blood, such as leukemias.

An early diagnosis is as important as prevention to get the best outcomes in cancer treatment. Being aware about cancer in is key to early diagnosis. Here are

some of the warning signs of cancer that need further medical attention:-

- o Cough or hoarseness that doesn't go away
- o Blood in sputum, stools or urine
- o Inter menstrual and post-menopausal bleeding
- o Lump in breast
- o Unusual lumps anywhere in the body that increase in size
- o Non-healing wound
- o Bleeding from gums
- o Frequent fever or infections
- o Excessive weight loss and loss of appetite
- o Intense and recurrent pain

Rugvedi Paygude (heart surgery)

Age -8 year's old
Bharati hospital (Pune)
Discharge date 17.10.2023.

Rugvedi kept falling ill frequently, her parents took her to Bharati Hospital, Pune for better diagnosis. She was detected with Atrial Septal Defect (ASD). It is a congenital heart defect. Patients with an ASD have a hole between the upper heart chambers. The hole increases the amount of blood going through the lungs. Doctors suggested immediate surgery for closure of ASD. TBCF team swung into immediate action arranging for necessary funds for the treatment. With support from kind hearted donors, team was able to fulfil the committed amount to Hospital. Now Rugvedi is absolutely fit and happy.

Mast. Naksh Dhanavat

Age -11 years old.

Criticare hospital (Thane)

Discharge date- 30.4.2024

On the unfortunate day, Naksh was playing with his friends in the Chawl's balcony. He slipped and fell headlong, impact was strong enough, he slipped into coma immediately with couple of bones broken.

He was shifted in ICU at Criticare Hospital, Thane. This was going to be prolonged treatment and expensive too. TBCF was referred this case for support. Team TBCF and Donors responded immediately and necessary funds was collected to sponsor the treatment.

Now Naksh is able to walk independently and able to complete his necessary chores.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT



"Education gives knowledge, but skills give wings to fly. Let's help the youth soar high."

The main objective of this tailoring training program is to enhance the quality of life of women and teenage girls through enhancement of their skills and knowledge.

The tailoring programme provides vocational training to women in stitching, embroidery and knitting. The centres run on mobile basis and post the completion at one location, needs assessment is conducted and a new village is identified for the implementation. Apart from sewing and tailoring, embroidery and basic knitting were also included in the programme so that the beneficiaries can utilize these skills in increasing their earning capacity. During the financial year, four batches of the training were done in two villages and 120 girls completed their three-month course.

Overall 210 Women from tribal community have been empowered with such Tailoring Skills.

TBCF imparted this training in association with implementing partner – Snehabhijan, in Dist: Sundergarh, Odisha.

Setting up Digital classrooms in Schools in rural areas of Palghar to installing Computer labs in schools in remote areas of Dist – Thane, Satara and one school in Chennai.

Total of 30 Desk tops were installed in 5 schools.

71 students from Slum area of Sangarsh Nagar, Chandivili, Mumbai were sponsored for courses in IT, namely – Advances Excel, Tally, Ms_CIT , Java & C++.

School library was set up in Aadarsh School, Bhangarwadi, Satara, Maharashtra.



NUTRITION FOR CHILDREN



Healthy nutritious diet is an essential component in the growing and developing years of children.

The children are provided 1 nutritious meal per day, within school premises, under supervision of School authorities.

As part of the event, we also shared snacks with 560 enthusiastic students, making it a memorable day filled with smiles and sunshine.

BAD TOUCH



- Touch that hurts or is forced
- Touching private areas (refer to the swimsuit rule)
- Told that it should be kept a secret
- Kissing on the mouth
- Spitting, slapping, pushing, punching, etc.
- Makes you feel bad, scared or ashamed
- Makes you feel uncomfortable sitting on the lap of adults [including distant family]

GOOD TOUCH



- Hugs or kisses from parents and grandparents
- Teacher pats your head or back and says "good job"
- Brief friendly hugs from parents & grandparents
- Brief kiss on the forehead or cheek
- Shaking hands, giving high fives or a fist bump
- Touch that does not scare or make you feel bad

Sessions for preparing children against sexual abuse

Children are our most precious and vulnerable members of society. They are deserving of love, care, and protection. We must ensure their safety and well-being, and create an environment where they can grow, learn, and thrive.

Our Team conducts sessions with young students in schools, making them aware on good & bad touch, we design sessions which can be done with children to prepare them to escape from child abuse.

Educating children about their right to set boundaries and seek help if they feel uncomfortable, empowers them to feel more confident in their ability to assess and react to uncomfortable situations.

RENEWAL ENERGY



"All energy is ultimately derived from the sun, and harvesting it directly through solar power seems to be the best way to transition to renewable energy"

TBCF installed Solar Street Lights, Solar Home light system (including solar powered ceiling Fans) and 1000Wp panel to power computer lab.

Installed panels generate 5020Wp or 5.02 kW per day under ideal conditions. Hence generating 1,832.3 kW per annum, saving precious fossil fuel and huge amount of energy bills for Schools. We have inaugurated new solar lights at Ashram Shala, Talivadi, empowering the school with sustainable energy.

“Hygiene is Two Thirds of Health”

WASH refers to safe drinking-water, sanitation and hygiene which are crucial to human health and well-being. Safe WASH is not only a prerequisite to health, but contributes to livelihoods, school attendance and dignity and helps to create resilient communities living in healthy environments.

Poor access to safe drinking water, toilets, and poor WASH practices due to poverty, lack of awareness and inaccessibility lead to several WASH related challenges.

Some of the consequences include:

Poor sanitation is linked to transmission of diseases such as cholera, diarrhoea, dysentery, Hepatitis A, typhoid, and polio and exacerbates stunting. Poor sanitation impacts human well-being, social and economic development due to anxiety, risk of sexual assault, and lost educational opportunities. Inadequate sanitation is estimated to cause 4,32,000 diarrhoeal deaths annually and is a major factor in several neglected tropical diseases, including intestinal worms, schistosomiasis, and trachoma. Poor sanitation also contributes to malnutrition.

This year TBCF renovated and constructed 12 toilets, washrooms in 4 Schools, in Dists of Satara and Thane.

Installed total 20,000 litres of water storage in 4 schools.






Chennai Rises with Resilience: TBCF and the Power of Collective Care






Homes were submerged, livelihoods battered, and communities fractured. Yet, amidst the wreckage, shone a beacon of hope the unwavering spirit of Chennai and the tireless efforts of organizations like TBCF (The Baby Care Foundation).

TBCF, like a swift current of compassion, surged into action. Recognizing the immediate need for sustenance and solace, they launched a vital Chennai Relief Distribution initiative. With 1500kgs of rice, 500kgs of Dal, 500 Litres of portable drinking water, and 1200kgs of other crucial dry food items, they reached out to 500 families in the most affected areas.




